
A REIVERS MOON A MUSICAL BY ALAN G BRYDON & IAN W LANDLES

The Borderland is now a haven of peace in a frenetic world but it was once a cauldron of strife - the home of the notorious Border reivers who gave the English language words like bereaved, blackmail and red-handed.

When the cry "The reivers are here!" was heard in a remote Border glen in the 16th Century no time was lost in lighting the beacon fire to warn of danger, in bringing the cattle into the protection of the vaulted lower storey of the peel tower and in locking wives and daughters safely out of harm's way for the reivers were wild men and "ill tae keep in order".



Teviotdale and the Borthwick valley lie in what was the Scottish Middle March, and it is here that history has recorded some of the most notorious reivers. One such was Auld Wat o' Harden who married the beautiful Mary Scott, the "Floo'er o' Yarrow" and they and their family held the tower of Harden between Hawick and Roberton.

History and folklore has made the reivers infamous. Yet as local people with families, lives and loves, there was nevertheless a warm blooded normality, which is perhaps lacking from our conventional memories of them. Without denying the well known violent side of our ancestors lan Landles and Alan Brydon hope that the audience will enjoy their production which brings to life a real reiving family in their own homeland where they, like us, were raised as proud Borderers!





The Torchlight Procession will muster at 6.45pm and leave the Common Haugh car park at 7pm (see map on page 31). Prior to this there will be torches and glow sticks on sale from 6pm. **Please note that torches will only be sold to those 16 years and over and parents are advised that lit torches should not be carried by young children.**

The procession will be led by the Hawick Scout Pipe Band from the Common Haugh and make its way, via the avenue and past the Museum and Hizzy Memorial, to the viewing area. (See map inside back page)

Please note that the main access to the fireworks viewing area is from the museum and that the other entrances to the fireworks display area will be closed off to access for safety reasons.

Please obey the stewards at all times they are there to ensure your safety.

There is lighting on the paths near the cafe (which will be open) and at the museum but it would be advisable to bring along a torch to aid in your safe exit from the area.

There will be a silver collection after the display finishes. Please give generously!

Wrap up and enjoy! Warm clothes and appropriate footwear advised. Please note there may be changes to this route depending on the weather. If changes should occur please listen to the stewards and any announcements before or after the display.



We are normally found marching beneath the banner of James Hamilton, 2nd Earl of Arran and Regent of Scotland.

TIME BANDITS

Time Bandits is a multi-period living history group, with a bias towards the Border wars and Anglo-Scottish reivers of the sixteenth century, John Sadler, leader of the group has quite extensively published works on the subject, as well as teaching, lecturing and re-enacting for the last twenty-five years. Their presentation includes an extensive handling collection, sword-play, storytelling, period food and music and they aim to bring history to life in an immersive and entertaining way for all ages.



EARL OF LOUDOUN'S REGIMENT OF FOOTE

Earl of Loudoun's Regiment of Foote (As part of the English Civil War Society) have members mainly based from in and around Scotland but there are some from further afield. Loudoun's was formed from Leslie's Dragoons in 1980 and have been operating around the UK ever since. As part of the English Civil War Society the Earl of Loudoun's Regiment of Foote, participates in the accurate re-enactment of 17th century life and warfare, we



meet at "musters" which can vary in size from small "living histories" and small drill displays up to full blown "majors" or battles. All arms of military life are employed in the society; regiments of infantry armed with pike and musket, squadrons of horse (cavalry) and batteries of ordnance (cannon).

We as a regiment have approximately 72 members (as of the end of 2018), but we can pull support from our parent society which numbers around a 1000 participants.

We concentrate on 17th Century re-enactment in general, 1640's in particular – our primary aim is to educate and inform on a little known but fascinating as well as important part of Scottish History, a time when Scotland was a military force to be reckoned with and a key player in the inappropriately named English Civil War.

Our mottoes are I Byde My Tyme (Historical) Love History? Live history (21st Century)

DOUGLAS RETINUE

The Douglas Retinue aims to bring to the public a vibrant, interactive and exciting interpretation of medieval military and civilian life during the latter half of the fifteenth century. We are able to put on a wide range of Living History events in Scottish history, through to the French one Hundred years War and subsequently the English Wars of the Roses. We portray members of the Douglas family Retinue who fight as a spear block this includes common foot soldiars.

LES AMIS D'ONNO

Les Amis d'Onno are an equestrian stunt team based just outside of Jedburgh. Les Amis originated in France performing equestrian theatre shows on beautiful Friesian & Andalusian horses, but in 2008 journeyed back to the family farm in the Scottish Borders. Since then the team have expanded to now having 22 fantastic horses who are key to providing entertaining stunt shows all over the UK & Ireland!

Les Amis Stunt shows consist of Jousting, Cossack Trick Riding, Wild Westerns and Highlander, where the horse and rider perform many different stunts such as vaulting off and back on, being dragged behind a horse and saddle falls.

But really the animals are the true stars of the shows. The dogs, horses and Billy

the goat, perform many tricks and have skills such as balancing on pedestals, liberty work and rearing.

For the past 13 years the team have enjoyed performing at the Hawick Reivers Festival and can't wait to be back this March!

It was only when George McDonald Fraser published his book 'The Steel Bonnets' that John realised he was in the heart of a fascinating area, rich in medieval history, including what he later found out to be the 'debatable land'.

Recently a family history mystery lead him to adventures in the borders of England and Scotland and particularly the South West of Scotland known in reiver times as the Scottish West March. His talk will include some of his personal history and that of the rebellious clans of the Irvings and Carruthers

Past President of the Hawick Archaeological Society and current Field and Syllabus Secretary. Long time interest in the history of Hawick and the surrounding area. 


JOHN NICHOL
